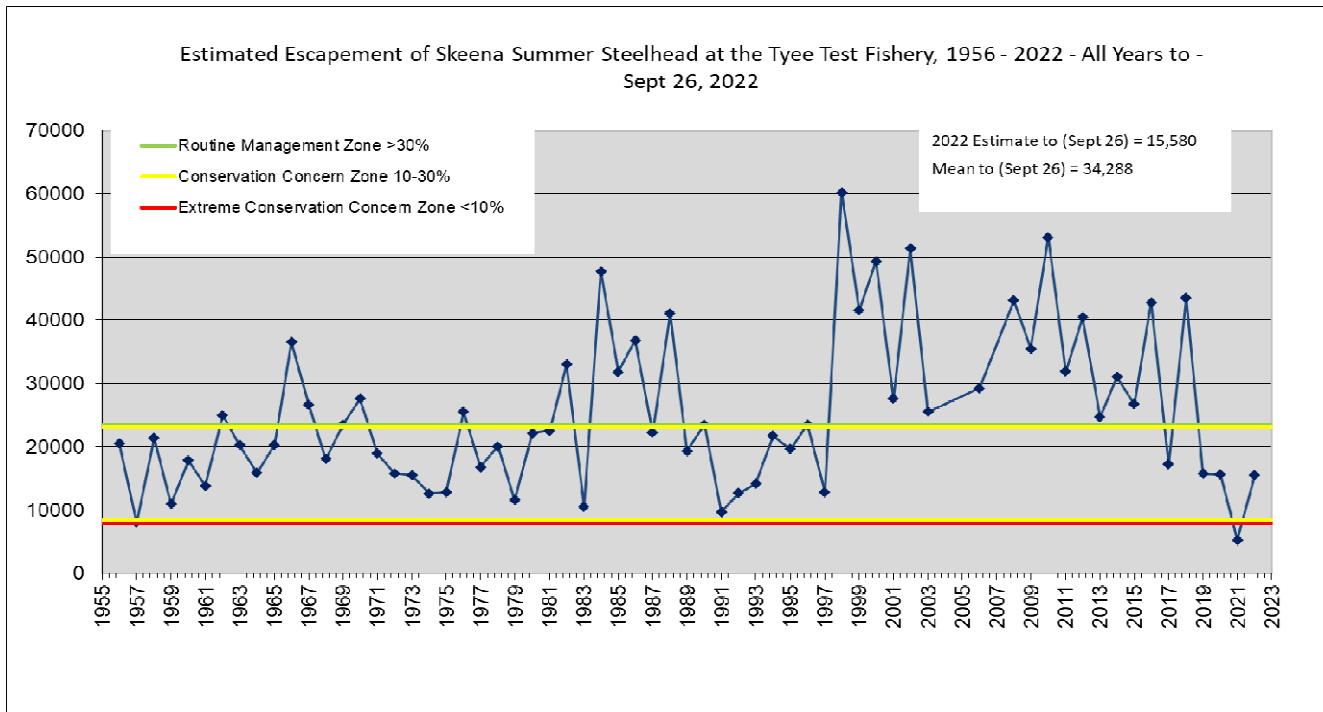

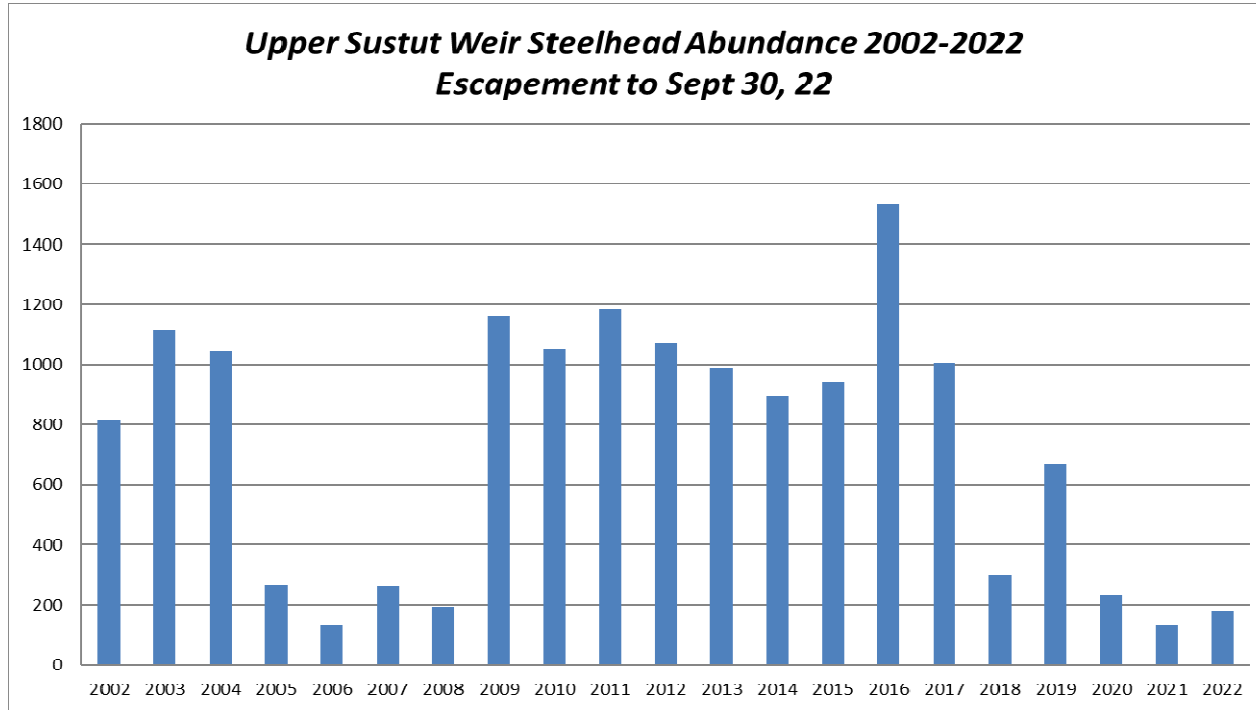
General Project Summary

Two Habitat Conservation Trust Foundation-funded projects were successfully delivered during the 2022-23 QWS funding cycle, providing fishery information to decision-makers, to better inform stakeholders and provide angling opportunity in the Skeena Region. Projects included an estimate of the aggregate abundance of the Skeena Interior Summer Steelhead ecotype via the Tyee Test Fishery and upper Skeena indicator stream via the upper Sustut River fence project. Steep reductions in quality water funding following the Covid-19 pandemic impacted the suite of summer steelhead projects annually delivered in region. As in previous years, lower than average summer steelhead abundance has resulted in small budget savings associated with fish bio-sampling and subsequent analysis.
